It encourages reporters to step into the shoes of diverse journalists and editorial teams, offering a more comprehensive and engaging coverage of the conference proceedings. Use the following tips in terms of the outlet you represent:

• RESEARCH YOUR OUTLET:

As a reporter, take the time to research and understand the media outlet you represent. Consider its reputation, editorial stance, target audience, and historical context. This knowledge will inform your reporting style and priorities.

• UNIOUE REPORTING STYLES:

Reporters are encouraged to adopt unique reporting styles and tones that align with their assigned media outlets.

• EDITORIAL PERSPECTIVE:

Reporters should maintain their respective media outlet's editorial perspective. This means they should report events and statements in a way that reflects the outlet's usual approach to news. For example, a conservative outlet might emphasise national interests, while a progressive one may prioritise global cooperation.

CONSISTENCY AND AUTHENTICITY:

While it's essential to have well-researched articles, be cautious to take notes during committee sessions. This will only enhance your research further.

• CONCISE ARTICLES:

Keep your articles concise and to the point. A strict limit of 350-500 words ensures that your readers get the essential information without unnecessary verbosity.

MAINTAIN AN OBJECTIVE VOICE:

Even though your articles are not opinion pieces, it's crucial to maintain a clear and objective voice. Avoid inserting personal opinions or biases into your reporting. Stick to the facts and provide a balanced view of the proceedings.

• PRIORITISE CLARITY:

Your primary goal is to communicate effectively. Write in a clear, straightforward manner that is accessible to a wide audience. Avoid unnecessary jargon or complex language that may confuse readers.

• VERIFY FACTS:

Fact-checking is a journalist's responsibility. Before publishing, double-check your facts and ensure the accuracy of the information. Cite sources whenever possible to substantiate your claims.

• HIGHLIGHT KEY MOMENTS:

Focus on capturing the most significant moments and decisions during committee sessions. Highlighting key quotes, resolutions, and debates helps readers grasp the essence of the discussions.

REPORT WITH INTEGRITY:

Maintain the highest standards of integrity and professionalism in your reporting. Avoid sensationalism, rumour-mongering, or distortion of facts. Your role is to inform, not to create sensational headlines. Be sensitive to cultural, political, and social nuances. Avoid offensive or disrespectful language or imagery in your articles.

• SEEK DIVERSITY IN SOURCES:

Encourage diversity in your reporting by seeking out a variety of sources and perspectives. Include voices from different countries, regions, and backgrounds to provide a well-rounded view of the conference.

GUIDELINES FOR CARICATURISTS

GUIDELINES FOR PHOTOGRAPHERS
